Christy Reiners, In His Steps Director, traveled to the Holy Land in February to deliver 310 wheelchairs to war-torn Gaza. The need is great. Christy will share her experiences and offer "on the ground" pictures, information, and future plans for this area. Resources will be shared. The PC (USA) has been calling for peace and justice since the Israeli occupation in 1948. Palestinian people live under a consistent and systematic process of apartheid and face expulsion from their land by Israel. This has become even more urgent nowadays with the massacre of Gaza's population.
